[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

To the Honorable the Senate & House of Representatives November 10th, 1830

The Humble Petition of Samuel Magby Respectfully Sheweth, That

During the Revolutionary War, he was for a time an Active Partisan, of those Patriots Who
fought, and bled for their Country, That he was under the Command of, and in the Regiment
Commanded by Colonel McDonald [Lieut. Col. Archibald McDonald], Under the General
Command of Francis Marion, as the enclosed Certificate will Shew: That from a Series of
Misfortunes he has been Compelled to call upon his Country for aid; That Country for Whom he
fought in the Glorious Struggle for Liberty and Independence: – He therefore respectfully begs
leave to state that he is now, in a State of Poverty, And also deprived of the use of his limbs. The
Worldly property of Which he is possessed, a list of which is hereunto annexed, is not Sufficient
for his Support; That he is obliged to his friends for the necessary Comforts of Life, and
therefore Respectfully Solicits the aid of Your Legislative Bounty according to the Act in that
Case made and provided.

And further Your Petitioner Saith not

Samuel Magby, X his mark

I do Certify that the facts Set forth in the above Petition are Just and true having been personally acquainted with Samuel Magby while he was in the Camp with General Marion's Squad.



The petition of sundry Citizens of Horry District Respectfully Sheweth to your Honorable body that at the last Session of the legislature that Samuel Magby a Citizen of this District was granted a pension and placed on the pension list and have received a pension this year.

We the under Signed do Certify that we have known Samuel Magby from our infancy and have always heard from the old Citizens & good Whigs of this District when living that Samuel Magby was a Tory in the Revolutionary War he has ever been called a Tory Cents our first recollection of him and we hope that your Honorable body will do Justice to the State by Stricking [Striking] his name from the pension list and your petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray (October 15th 1831) [abbreviated names have been extended]

South Carolina

Horry District Personally came before me James McCracking [sic] & made Oath that as regards being well acquainted with Samuel Magby in the Revolutionary war I was not I knew Samuel Magby in the first & middle of the war & knew him to be a Tory near about the close of the war I saw Samuel Magby in Genl. Marion's Camp.

The affidavit which is copied above I am told by my Representative accompanied Samuel Magby's petition with my name Signed to it if I signed the above affidavit I was taken in & or told the Justice I could not swear that Samuel Magby was a faithful Soldier in the Revolutionary War I could only Say that I saw Samuel Magby in General Marion's Camp about the close of the War.
