I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Know all Men by these Presents that I Thomas Black have Bargained and Sold unto Benjamin Hensley my Negro<sup>2</sup> which I was to Draw from serving ten months under the command of General [Thomas] Sumter as a Light Dragoon in the State of South Carolina. As witness my hand and seal this 12<sup>th</sup> day of August 1782

I do assign over my right of the above Claim to David murah [sic] for value received as witness my hand this 3 Day of June 1790
