Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Resolved That the Children of John Booth late a Soldier in the 3rd Continental Regiment are entitled to such Emoluments as are provided by the Legislature for the Families of Soldiers who have lost their lives in the Service – And that the Treasurers be required to pay to Robert Gaston or his Order such Monies as are or may become due to the said Children for their Use & Behoove

Also that the Auditor be directed to pass an account in favor of said John Booth for Arrears of pay as a private Soldier from January 1st, 1780, till June 23rd 1780, the time of his Death –

Ordered that the Resolution be sent to the Honorable the Senate for their concurrence.
