Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

The humble petition of Amos Breeland of the said State being reduced to poverty in the extreme by reason of Infirmity And not having the Means of support am Obligated to throw myself upon the Mercy and tender feelings of my Country men praying that as I served through the revolution War faithfully as a Soldier fighting for Liberty and Independence which through God's blessing we obtained, that my Situation be taken into consideration and that I may be allowed the means for my support which my country has provided. The above Sworn to before me this 26th day of September 1827 by the Petitioner
