I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

This day personally appeared before me Rig[?] Brunner [sic] a Soldier in Colonel William Hill's Regiment [text too faint to discern] made oath as the law directs that he did Service in the State Troops of South Carolina commanded by General Sumpter [Thomas Sumter] and I the said Rignhart Brunner am Justly entitled to one Negro according to the terms of the Enlistment made by the said General and that he the said Rignhart Brunner did not violate the said title nor sell nor dispose of the said Negro to any person whatsoever or [several words too faint to discern] the same from me.
