Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

This day personally appeared before me John Bruster a Soldier in Colonel Henry Hampton's Regiment and Captain John Foster's Company and made Oath as the law Directs that by his Service in the State troops of South Carolina Commanded by General Sumter [Thomas Sumter] and that he the said John Bruster is Justly entitled to a Negro Agreeable to the terms of the Enlistment made by the said General and that the said John Bruster did not Violate his said title nor sell nor dispose of said Negro to any person whatsoever but to James Maxwell (and that the said Negro is the one that he the said John Bruster is entitled to for his own Personal Service in the State troops of South Carolina) who hath purchased the said Negro and paid the full Sum of one hundred pounds in Gold & Silver this Receipt shall be good to the public of South Carolina and no other further the said Deponent saith upon his Oath that he never converted to his own use public horses saddles bridles arms or ammunition or conveyed them away but what he made use of in the public Service and further saith not.
