Pension Application of Charles Bryan W2750 Catharine Bryan MD [PA] Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

Lycoming County Ss.

On this seventh day of may in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of common pleas in and for said County, personally appears Charles Bryan aged 64 years resident in Lycoming county afs'd, who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" that he the said Charles Bryan enlisted in the Town of Leonard [Leonardtown] St. Marys county, state of Maryland in the year 1776 in the company commanded by Capt. John Allen Thomas in the regiment commanded by Colonel William Small [sic: William Smallwood], for one year that he serve the year in the Maryland line in the same corps, that he enlisted again in 1777 in Leonard Town St. Mary's County in the State of Maryland in the company commanded by Captain John Davidson in 2nd Maryland Regiment commanded by Colonel Thomas Price Maryland line for three years or during the war, and that he served the time for which he was enlisted in the same corps, when he was regularly discharged that he again enlisted in 1780 in the City of Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania in the 5th Troop Capt'n. David Hopkins of the 4th Regiment of Light Dragoons, commanded by Coln. Stephen Moylan Pennsylvania line, for during the war, and served the time for which he was enlisted in the same Corps, when he was discharged from service in the Town of Lancaster in the State of Pennsylvania, that he was in the Battles of Long Island [27 Aug 1776], White Plains [28 Oct 1776], Brandywine [11 Sep 1777], Germantown [4 Oct 1777] and at the taking of Lord Cornwallis [19 Oct 1781], and that he is in reduced circumstances in life and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.

On this sixth day of September 1820 personally appeared in open court of Common Pleas held in Williamsport for the county of Lycoming, being a court of record proceeding according to the course of common law with a jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount, and keeping a record of proceedings Charles Bryan aged sixty six years resident in Lycoming County in said district who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the acts of Congress of the eighteenth of March 1818 and 1st of May 1820. That he served in the revolutionary War in the company commanded by Capt A. Thomas with Regiment commanded by Col William Smallwood in the line of the State of Maryland and has obtained a pension under the act of the 18th March 1818 his certificate being numbered 3778 and dated October 20th AD 1818 to commence May 7th 1818. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income
