State of Virginia – Frederick County

On this 10th day of August 1838 personally appeared before me William S. Jones – a Justice of the peace in and for the County aforesaid Mary Williamson a resident of Middletown in the County aforesaid, aged Eighty-one – years who, being duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 7th 1838, entitled "an act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows." That she is the widow of Isaac Williamson who was a Sergeant in the 4th North Carolina Battalion, as will more fully appear by reference to the said Isaac Williamson's discharge from said service bearing date the ___day of August 1779 signed Jn Armstrong Major – She further declares that she was married to the said Isaac Williamson on the 7th day of August 1824, that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the 1st of January 1794, viz. at the time above stated.
