Virginia Rejected Claim of John Drewry VAS1049

I James Hubbard aged 61 years do hereby certify that I was acquainted with John Drewry who was formerly of Warwick county and am certain, though from my being young at the time will not speak positively, that he enlisted as a private early in the Revolutionary war in the continental service. I recollect distinctly that he the said John came to my father's who resided in Warwick county and was there sick, it was said of a consumption, that he became while there better, so much so, that as well as I can recollect he returned to the army, after which I learned he died in service I think about the year 1779. This disease he contracted while in service I was told. Jas Hubbard
