The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I Robert Russel¹ of the County of Accomack Aged seventy-two years well knew George Knox in the ninth Virginia Regiment during the Revolutionary War. I was amongst the first that enlisted and enlisted for a Tower [tour] of three years and served until I was Regularly discharged and I further say that George Knox served for a tower of three years but cannot say how much longer and he was Regularly discharged. Given under my hand this ninth day March 1831
