I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." At a Court held for Ohio County [Virginia] on Monday the first day of October 1792 Present James Caldwell, Zachariah Spriggs, William Sutherland & David Chambers Gentlemen Ordered that it be certified to the Executive of this State that Mary Dodd formally widow of Thomas Knox deceased who was a Sergeant in the Twelfth Virginia Regiment commanded by Colonel James Wood died in the service of this State March the 10th 1778, [she] is still living and it is the opinion of the Court that she the said Mary ought to draw pay as the widow of said Knox from the said 10th day of March until she married Charles Dodd which happened the 4th day of August 1782
