Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Kentucky County of Harrison

I John Jenkins aged 73 years do upon oath testify and declare that I entered the service of the United States on the \_\_ day of \_\_ in the year 1778 for the Term of During the War and that I served in the company commanded by \_\_ in the Regiment number 3<sup>rd</sup> commanded by Colonel Mathews\* of the Virginia State line, and was honorably discharged on the day of October in the year 1783, from the Regiment commanded by Colonel Mathews.\*

I Further declare that I have never received a warrant for the Bounty Land promised to me on the part of the state of Virginia nor have I ever assigned or transferred my claim in any manner whatsoever: therefore,

Know all men by these presents, that I John Jenkins aforesaid do hereby constitute and appoint William H Todd to be my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name to demand and receive from the State of Virginia a warrant for the quantity of Land due to me as aforesaid; and my said attorney is hereby fully authorized and empowered to constitute and appoint one or more substitutes or attorneys under him for the special purposes above expressed.

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December 1783, in the name of John Jenkins, as a Soldier Cavalry for £12.0.0, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Capt. Ragsdale and was given for services prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> January 1782.
