Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Kentucky Garrard County Sct.

This day George Tennell¹ and Robert Green personally came before me James Robertson a Justice of the peace in and for the State and County aforesaid and they made oath as follows (to wit) That they were personally acquainted with James Johnson a private in Captain Wm Watts [William Watts'] company of dragoons commanded by Colonel White [Anthony Walton White] and to their knowledge he entered the service for and during the continuance of the war and that he served faithfully to the end of the war and was legally discharged in 1783 after the close of the war his discharge they believe has been lost or mislaid without fraud or design.
