Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Essex County, 25<sup>th</sup> of March 1813

At the request of Mr. John Jones Senior to whom a pension of Forty Dollars per annum was allowed by an act of the Virginia Assembly passed at the Session before the last; this is [to] certify that he is still living. Given under my hand the day and year aforesaid.

To the Honorable the Speaker and members of the House of delegates

The petition of John Jones senior of the County of Essex respectfully represents to your honorable body that he served as a soldier in the Revolutionary war and in the attack against Charlestown [Charleston, South Carolina] he was wounded in the arm in a half moon battery; that your petitioner has become very much disabled in consequence of said wounds; and prays your honorable body would pass a law placing him on the pension list; and as in duty bound will ever pray &c &c

This day Elijah Moody personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace for the County aforesaid and made Oath that John Jones Senior of the aforesaid County, Served in the Revolutionary war, as a Soldier and was wounded in the arm at a Half Moon battery in the attack against Charlestown. Given under my hand this 30<sup>th</sup> day of November 1811
