[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From rejected pension records in the Library of Virginia]

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of December 1783, in the name of Lewellen Jones, as a Soldier of Infantry for £34.1.11, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Thomas Collins and was given for services prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> January 1782.

Given under my hand, at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1839.

State of Virginia: Charlotte County to wit:

I do hereby certify that I was well acquainted with Lewellen Jones, deceased, late of Campbell County, Virginia, in the War of the Revolution, and recollect distinctly that in the early part of the year 1776 he enlisted in Charlotte County, where he then lived, under Captain John Brent as a regular soldier for the term of three years, and was attached to the 4<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment on Continental establishment commanded by Colonel Lawson [Robert Lawson] and General Stevens [Edward Stevens]. He was engaged in several battles to the North, and served the said term faithfully, and was regularly discharged from service.

These facts come within my personal knowledge being with him the whole time. I am in the  $80^{th}$  year of my age – and was a soldier of the Revolution.

To his Excellency the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia:

The Memorial of the Heirs and legal representatives of Lewellen Jones, deceased, late of Campbell County, Virginia, who was a Private in the State line of Virginia on Continental

establishment in the War of the Revolution: Respectfully sheweth:

That the said Lewellen Jones in the year 1776 enlisted under Captain John Brent in the County of Charlotte, for the term of Three years, and was attached to the 4<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Virginia on Continental establishment, commanded by Colonel Lawson – That the said Lewellen Jones served the full period for which he enlisted, and was regularly discharged from service. All of which will more readily appear by reference to the Army register of the Continental line, and the accompanying certificates of old and credible soldiers who served with him in the War of the Revolution.

Your Memorialist further state that the said Lewellen Jones in his lifetime, never applied for, or drew the Land Bounty promised by the State of Virginia to her Continental soldiers: nor have the heirs of said Lewellen Jones since his death applied for or drawn the same Land Bounty

Your Memorialist, therefore, humbly pray that your Excellency will grant them the usual quantity of Bounty Land allowed to a soldier of the State line of Virginia on Continental establishment for the term of three years service, pursuant to the laws of Virginia in such case made, and provided – and as in duty bound shall ever pray etc. etc.
