



Tapp'a. [Tappahannock] Essex Intervening Court held April 21st 1795

It appearing to the Court that Philip Evans was on the Pension list for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety three, and that he [was?] omitted in the list for 1795; It is Ordered to be Certified that he should still be continued as a Pensioner A Copy Teste/ Geo. W. Lee D.C EC

I do with advice of Council hereby certify that Philip Evans who was a soldier in the line of this state during the late war and in the course thereof received wounds which have rendered him unable to support himself by labour, is put on the list of pensioners with an Allowance of ten pounds yearly commencing the fifteenth day of December One thousand seven hundred and ninety one, pursuant to an act of General Assembly, on that day passed, "for allowing pensions to sundry persons herein mentioned"

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richmond this 6th day of June 1795
