Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do hereby certify that Captain Thomas Jones enlisted as a Soldier in Captain James Franklin's company from Amherst County belonging to the 10<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment commanded by Colonel Edward Stevens on Continental establishment either in the month of December 1776 or January 1777 for 3 years, which term of service he performed with fidelity to his country and honor to himself, and I do further certify that the said Thomas Jones was promoted to the rank of Sergeant and acted as such until discharged.
