[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

The deposition of Zadock Bailey¹ aged seventy-six years being first duly sworn according to law deposeth and saith that he was well acquainted with Edmund Joynes, John Joynes, Edmund Dickerson, Sergeant William Silverthorn, Sergeant Severn Dellastatious [Severn Delastatius]² first Sergeant Selby Dellastatious & Thomas Fisher who enlisted under Captain Thomas Parker as he was called when I enlisted with him but some days he only had a Lieutenant's Commission the above named enlisted when I did for Eighteen months, Thomas Colona was our Lieutenant and we marched in the latter part of the summer in the year 1781 and joined the 11th Regiment at Richmond and Captain Parker [perhaps Thomas Parker] returned Home and then we were commanded by Thomas Coverley our former Steward, we were stationed at Cumberland Court House, where our time of service was up and then myself, with those named above with several others from Accomack County enlisted during the war and served till the end of the war. General Lewening Bing was our General and we were discharged and paid off by him after that time and further this deponent saith not.

This day came before me a Justice of the peace of Accomack and made oath to the above Deposition and is entitled to credit. Given under my hand and seal this 5th day of January 1833 S/ Henry Fletcher, JP
