I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From bounty land records in the Library of Virginia]

I do certify that when settling John Hansons [sic John Hanson's] account with the Auditors, I neglected getting his Land Warrant.

He enlisted early in 1777 under Captain Roland Madison of the 12<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment – & continued in service for the Term of three years & is entitled to a portion of land allowed by act of Assembly.

Given under my hand this 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1786 S/ Ro Gamble, late Capt. [Robert Gamble] 8<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment

Pleas to issue a Land Warrant that I am entitled to for 3 years Service in the Virginia Continental line – & deliver it to Robert Gamble & oblige your very humble servant, August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1785 S/ John Hanson, X his mark
