## Bounty Land Warrant information relating to Rodham Harcum VAS1383 vsl 1VA Transcribed by Will Graves 2/14/14

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do hereby authorize and Impower Mr. Samuel Blackwell to receive all the Warrant due me from the Country for my service in the Navy [several indecipherable words] Warrant and witness my hand this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1783

Ide integlander and Impound It Samuel Blackwell lances

If the Warman dur and from the boundary for any former your

Harranton Walnut formy hand there 2 day of December 1922

These to Certify that Rodham Harcum enlisted with me the 19<sup>th</sup> day of January 1777 to serve in the Navy as [several words too faint to discern] for the term of 3 years which time he served true and faithfully and was discharged. Given under my hand this 19<sup>th</sup> day of January 1780.

When the Virginia Navy Galley *Protector* was captured and burned at Wicomico Warehouse on 7 July 1779, her captain, John Thomas, and the remaining crew were transferred to the *Dragon*. After remaining with her for a short time they were again transferred to the ship *Washington*. Isaac Booth, from the *Protector*, was listed as a pilot aboard the *Dragon* on 2 September 1779 and 7 October 1779.
