Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I John Bell do hereby certify that John Hardyman enlisted at the commencement of the American War against Great Britain and that the said Hardyman served two years in the 6^{th} Virginia Regiment on Continental establishment – And again enlisted under Colonel Porterfield [probably Charles Porterfield] for three years, and marched to the South. Given under my hand this 23^{rd} day of February 1808

Charles City County,

This day John Bell came before me one of the Commonwealths Justices of the Peace for the County aforesaid, and made oath to the above certificate. Given under my hand this 23rd day of February 1808.

I do hereby certify that John Hardyman enlisted early in the American Revolutionary War and served during it – and that the said Hardyman served in the North and South in the Army on Continental establishment.
