THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof William Foster a Soldier in the first Virginia regiment, having faithfully served the United States from the 20th January 178[last digit missing in the online image] to this date and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 6th July 1783 By order of the secretary at war, B Lincoln [Gen. Benjamin Lincoln Jos. [illegible] Sec'y Registered in the books of the regiment,/ William Eskridge [pension application W4192]

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough.
