Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From pension records in the Library of Virginia]

At a Court held for Hanover County on Thursday the 7<sup>th</sup> day of September 1786

The Court do Certify that David Hogan late a Continental Soldier under the Command of Captain Richard C Anderson [Richard Clough Anderson] of the 5<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment died in the said service and that his widow Mary Hogan is in such indigent circumstances as renders a pension proper and necessary.

I do with advice of the Council hereby certify that Mary Hogan widow of David Hogan who was a private in the 5<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment and died in the service of the United States is entitled to the sum of 5 Pounds yearly; which allowance is to commence on the first day of January 1787 Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, at Richmond, this 26 day of October, 1787.
