Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do Certify that William Holderbe enlisted prior to January 1782 for the war & served as a Sergeant from that time to the end thereof in the Virginia Continental line. Given in Richmond October 26, 1785

S/ S. Hawes, Lt. Colo. [Samuel Hawes] 1st V. Regt.

For value received I do assigned to William Reynolds the Balance of pay Gratuity & bounty of Land due me who was a Sergeant prior to January 1782 & enlisted for the war which claim I warrant & oblige myself to make good to the said Reynolds should any thing happen so as to prevent the settlement of the same agreeable to the true intent & meaning of this agreement.
