Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I do Certify that William Perry Served as a Soldier in the 2nd Virginia Regiment Continental Establishment for the term for which he was enlisted and received no pay from the last day of November 1779 was entitled to pay until the 23rd of August 1780 at which time he was discharged, he enlisted the 23rd of August 1777, was discharged in 1780.

Given under my hand this 31 day of May 1783.
