Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Mr. Price will be pleased to say whether John Hughes as Sergeant Major is entitled to any further allowance of land for three years Service.

There appears only one warrant to have issued to John Hughes, which was on a certificate for service as a private.

It appears by the Register in this office that John Hughes a soldier of infantry received a Certificate on the 19<sup>th</sup> of July 1783 amounting to £101.3.9 and another person of the same name received a Certificate as a soldier of Cavalry on the 17 April 1784 amounting to £23.10.0
