## Pension application of John Hughes VAS1653 Transcribed by Will Graves

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do, with the advice of the Council, hereby certify, that John Hughes, aged 32 years late a Sergeant in Harrison's Regiment of Artillery appears to have been disabled in such a manner while in the service of the United States as to entitle him to the sum of Eighteen Pounds yearly; which allowance is accordingly made him, to commence from the first day of January 1786.

I certify that John Hughes was a Sergeant in Colonel Harrison's Regiment of Artillery in the beginning of the year 1777, when I joined it and I then understood that he had been among the first enlisted in what was called the old company of Artillery raised under Captain Innis [James Innis], that in spring 1778 when the Regiment was inoculated for the Small Pox at Cealey's previous to the march of said Regiment to the northward the said John Hughes became blind from that disorder.

Given under my hand this 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 1787 S/ Samuel Coleman Lieutenant 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment of Artillery Samuel Loleman St. 1" Regiment of Arty

At a Court held for Fluvanna County April the 5<sup>th</sup> 1787

John Hughes produced a Certificate from his Excellency the Governor of his being admitted to the Pension List with a Pension of eighteen pounds and made oath that he is the person to whom the same was given, and it being compared with the List transmitted to the clerk by the Auditors and appearing to be right is ordered to be recorded & ordered that the Sheriff pay the said John Hughes that the said sum of eighteen pounds as the law directs.

**Bedford County Court 1788** 

John Hughes late a Sergeant in Harrison's Regiment of Artillery exhibited in Court a Certificate of his being allowed the sum of Eighteen Pounds annually as a pension & having made oath according to law & the Court having compared the same with the list of Pensioners & finding it to be right It is Ordered that the same be recorded and that the Sheriff pay the said John Hughes the sum of Eighteen pounds as aforesaid

George Monday [could be Mooday] Administrator of John Hughes deceased came into court and made satisfactory proof that the said John Hughes late a Sergeant in Harrison's Regiment of artillery departed this life the 6<sup>th</sup> day of December 1788 & at the time of his Deceased the said Hughes was Entitled to a balance of a Pension allowed him by Government amounting to Sixteen Pounds Sixteen Shillings (the same commencing the first of January 1788 at £18.0.0 per annum) and It is Ordered that the Sheriff of this County paid the said Balance to George Mody [sic] his legal Representative
