Virginia Pension Claim of Andrew Green VAS1676

Be it enacted by the General Assembly that Andrew Green who in Consequence of wounds received in the Service of his Country during the late War was placed on the List of Pensioners with an allowance of twelve pounds per Annum which under the operation of an act Concerning Pensioners passed in the year 1785 was discontinued, shall be readmitted on the Pension List, and entitled to have and receive the annual Sum of twelve pounds. And be it further enacted by the General Assembly that the Auditor of Public Accounts, on application to him made, either in person or by Attorney, shall issue to the said Andrew Green the Arrears of pension at the Rate aforesaid form the period of it's discontinuance to the present Time. This Act shall commence & be in force from and after the passing thereof.

I Andrew Green, Cameron Parish, County of Loudoun, & State of Virginia do hereby Constitute and appoint James Lane Triplett of Loudoun County & State of Virginia my Lawfull Attorney to received in my behalf of the Auditor of Public Accounts for the Commonwealth of Virginia, or any other person authorized, by law, to pay the same, my Pension, & arrearages of Pension, as an invalid, agreeably to an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, passed the October Session 1793.

Fairfax County Sct.

Andrew Green came before a justice of peace for this County and made oath, that he is the same Andrew Green, to whom the original certificate was granted. That he served in the first Regiment of Virginia at the time he was disabled, and that he now resides in the County of Fairfax, and has resided there for the last nine years, previous to which, he resided in the County of Frederick, Va. Given under my hand this 1st Jan'y 1816.

NOTE: The file contains miscellaneous documents relating to the pension, the last of which is a power of attorney for the year 1817. Beginning about 1800 Green's pension was paid in Fairfax County VA, in Jan 1803 it was stated that he was a resident of Fauquier County VA, and in 1805 he lived in Frederick County VA before returning to Fairfax County in 1806. In the final document he was a resident of Wood County in what is now West Virginia.
