To the Legislature of Virginia

The petition of Edward Lewis of the County of Patrick an Invalid pensioner respectfully sheweth, that in consequence of a wound which he received in the Revolutionary War he was by an act of the General assembly of Virginia placed many years since on the pension List the amount of which was not to exceed \$50 and to be allowed and certified annually by the Court of the County in which your petioner may reside

That he is now fair advanced in life extremely poor and almost totally incapasitated from Labour, with a Large family mostly females and dependent on his Exertions for a support wherefor he prays your Hon'ble body will take his case into Consideration and augment his pension – and in duty bound he will ever pray &c.

This day Edward Lewis appeared personally before me Edward Philpott a justice of the peace for the county aforesaid and made oath to the truth of the allegation in the foregoing petition Contained. Given under my hand this 14th day of [undeciphered] 1820 Edward Philpott
