Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

To the Honorable the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Virginia –

The Petition of William Langley, Senior, James Bartee, Junior, Samuel Bartee, James Williams, John Portlock, Ann G. McClean, John Redd and Rubin Wilde, humbly sheweth

That your Petitioners in the year 1777 enlisted and entered on board the ship's Caswell¹ and Washington² belonging to this Commonwealth, which was ordered to protect the Sounds and Coast of the State of North Carolina, and on board of which Ships, your said Petitioners served for a length of time, as will appear from the Certificates of the Officers of the said Ships here with sent and annexed. Your Petitioner's further show, that they have received a partial payment of the wages due them as per Credit given here with sent in account and will more fully appear by the Journal of the Navy Board, to which your Petitioners beg leave to refer, and pray that it may be considered as part of their Petitions,

That from the said credits and Journals of the Navy Board it will appear that the payments were made in paper money at a depreciated value, when the same was of little or no value to your Petitioner's: –

They therefore humbly hope that your Honors will not only pay them the balance of their wages which is still due, but will also make them a reasonable Compensation for the depreciation of the money heretofore paid them: – Annual Petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray &c





William Langley's account showing service on board of the *Caswell* and *Washington* under Capt. Willis Wilson³ for 591 days




Archibald Portlock's account showing service on the *Caswell* and *Washington* under Capt. Willis Wilson for 365 days



Joshua Williams' account showing service on the *Caswell* and *Washington* under Capt. Willis Wilson for 412 days


