To the Hon'ble the Speaker & Members of the general Assembly

The petition of William Cheatham Humbly Sheweth

That in february 1778 he inlisted as a Soldier in The fifth Virginia Regiment & Continued in service untill february 1779 when he was discharged, that he has never Received from the Auditor of public accounts His pay & depreciation for his said services, and prays the Certificates thirfor may now be granted Him and he as in duty bound prays &c.

Chesterfield Sc.

This day Benj Cheatham came before me a Magistrate for the s'd County & made Oath that he had seen William Cheatham in Possession of his discharge as a Soldier, belonging to Capt. James Baytops Comp'y. that he was with William Cheatham when he lost a Pocket-Book, in which he said was the s'd discharge. Given under my hand this 9th day of Octo. 1792. Francis Goode

This Man inlisted in feb'y 1778 for one year and was discharged in Feb'y 1779 in 5 Virg Regiment. nothing herein can be done. J Howell

The Claim mentioned in this Pet'o. has not been settled for by the State/ J. Pendleton 5 Nov 1793
