## Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

On Examination of John McClanahan who appears to be about thirty years of age \* the right Leg has had the Tibia shattered & broken to pieces in a very great \* & from the loss of Bone, the Leg has become quite crooked & almost use\* to which misfortune a remaining cario\* still continues from the op\* of the ulceration now on the Leg, & which \* has ever been the case \* the first receipt of Injury – am well sattisfied he is disabled from supporting himself by hard Labour only & that his sufferings must have been \* indeed 3rd March 1788 \* Foushee

I do with the advice of the Council hereby certify that John McClananahan aged about 30 years, late a private in a detachment of the Virginia Line commanded by Lieut Colo. Campbell whose pay was at the rate of £24 per annum, was disabled in the service of the United states by a wound in his right leg; and that he is allowed the sum of Twelve pounds yearly, to commence from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1786. Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richmond this 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 1788
