Culpeper County towit September Term 1811

Peter Triplett [Peter H. Triplett, possibly pension application W2706] came into Court and made Oath that he was well acquainted with John Asher who was a Soldier in the 1<sup>st</sup> Virginia State Regiment and engaged to serve the term of three years and that he died in the said Service of the small pox in the Town of Alexandria, and Charles Asher [possibly S30833] came into Court & made oath that William Asher was the eldest Brother of the aforesaid John Asher and that he is since dead and that Bartlett Asher is his eldest son
