


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Simon Akers VAS2194

Monroe County to wit

This day Simon Akers and William Richmond [pension application S9088] Came before me a Justice of the peace for said County and made oath that they Enlisted with Captain Matthew Arbuckle in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy five, and was Enrolled, Mustered, and drew their pay from the 12th of September in the year aforesaid unto the 10th day of October in the year 1778 at which time they was regularly Discharged as part of the 12th Virginia Regiment and Simon Akers one of the Deponants applys by George Clendenen formerly one of the Delegates for the county of Greenbrier, for the Depreciation of his pay, who Receiv'd the same as he believes from a Certificate from the Auditors office to that Effect. Sworn to and Signed before me this 19th day of November in 1799.
