These are to Certify that Nathan Anthoney Formerly a Soldier in the 10<sup>th</sup> Virg'a Reg't has duly and faithfully served the term of three years for which he was enlisted in consequence of which and at his own request he is hereby discharged from any farther service in the Army of the United States & permitted to return to his home free [two undeciphered words] – he having rec'd all his bounty pay & clothing & Deficiencies of pay & Clothing in full of all allowances & provision made by the Congress for their [undeciphered word] his receipt for which is on the back hereof

Given under my hand at Philadelphia this 4<sup>th</sup> day of Feb'y 1780 Chris'n Febiger [Christian Febiger VAS675] Colo Com. 2<sup>d</sup> V. B.

I do certify that Nathan Anthony enlisted as a soulder in the service of the United States in the Virg'a. Cont'l. Line and that he served three years, when he was regularly discharged
