[The following are from rejected claims in the Library of Virginia.]

The deposition of Thomas Buck [S16672] taken at Front Royal Warren County Virginia this [illegible] day of December 1837 before [undeciphered name] a Justice of the Peace for the said County [two or three undeciphered words] being first duly Sworn deposeth and sayeth that he the said Thomas Buck was well acquainted with Nathaniel Ashby formerly of Fauquier County Virginia, that he went to School with him when they were boys, that he was an Officer in the revolutionary war, a Lieutenant. This deponent [undeciphered word] he is of the opinion he was in the Continental Service, he is not certain wheather he was promoted to a captaincy or not but believes he was. he was called Captain Ashby. deponent is not certain as to the length of his service but believes he served several years three or more years. he saw him in Uniform at several times and places, he moved to Kentucky about the year 178[?] where he is informed he died
