Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor pros [?ofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

The Bearer Thomas Pollock of the [illegibly faint] Virginia Regiment having served the full time for which he was enlisted is hereby discharged from the Service.

Given under my hand at the Camp in [illegibly faint] this 21st day of July 1779

The Deaser Thomas Pollock of the Holling in a Right having versed the full line for which he was and tisted is hereby discharged from the Service.

Given ander my Harle at the Game we the Come.

This 21 May of the 1770.

I do Certify that Thomas Pollock enlisted in Colonel Hugh Stephenson's Regiment of Riflemen on the 24th day of July 1776 & that he received no pay for the space between that Day and the first January 1777. Given under my hand this 22nd of October 1785




