Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Sacker Bayly VAS2349

[The following are from bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia.]

Zadock Bayly [Zadock Bayley S37696] who is a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity & entitled to full confidence, made oath before me this day that he was drafted for 18 months in Capt Tho Parkers [Thomas Parker] Company of infantry in the Virginia Continental line & that he afterwards reinlisted during the War & served till July 1783 and was then discharged on condition of entering the service again if required & that in 1784 he drew a warrant for 200 acres of land for his services – that he was well acquainted with Sacker Bayly who enlisted in said Company to serve during the War, & that he did serve until the War ended with the witness under Captain Parker & Coverly [probably Thomas Coverly S24960]. Witness my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace at Accomack Co this 1st day of June 1833.

Spencer Kellam [W1178] who is a Revolutionary pensioner and a man of unquestionable veracity, made oath before me that he served a tour of 18 months in Capt. Parkers company of infantry in the continental line in the War of the Revolution and that he was well acquainted with Sacker Bayly of the same County (Accomack) and that said Sacker Bayly entered the said Company to serve as a soldier during the War, and that he did serve until the end of the War under Captains Parker & Coverly. Witness my hand & Seal at Accomack Co Va this 10th day of June 1833 Wm. R. Curtis J.P.

I certify that John Charnock Sen'r [S38598] who is a Revolutionary pensioner and a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that he served a tour of 18 months in Capt. Thomas Parker's Company in the Va. Continental line in the War of the Revolution and that he was well acquainted with Sacker Bayly of Accomack County (the same place in which the witness resides) and that said Sacker Bayly enlisted in the same company to serve during the war, and that he did serve till the War ended under Captains Parker & Coverly – as witness my hand & seal at Accomack County Va this 21st day of June 1833 as a Justice of the peace.
