I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." We do hereby Certify that we knew Benjamin Porter as an officer in the Last Revolutionary War with greate Brittain he entered into Service in the year 1775 and continued upwards of five years as a Lieutenant, Captain & Mager [Major] he commanded in the Second Virginia Redgiment on Continental establishment.
