I do hereby Certify the James Bedford Serj't. [Sergeant] in the fifth Virginia Rejiment enlisted with me in the month of December one thousand seven hundred and seventy eight for the war.

James Bedford having some pretentions to his Discharge from the army which he at Preasant is not able to make appear so fully as is necessary – he has therfor leave of absence from the Service for two Months in order to procure such Certificats as may be Necessary Respecting this matter
