Know all men by these presents that we Mathew Grigg [Matthew Gregg (Grigg) S35981] and James Bell of the County of Campbell of the State of Kentucky do by these presents make constitute appoint & ordain our Friend James Taylor of the said County & State to be our true & lawful attorney for us & in our name to ask for & demand & receive of the Register of the State of Virginia all Land Warrants which we or either of us are entitled to for services in the late war between the United States & great Britaine the said Grigg being a private & the said Bell a Sargent. & we do also empower him to call on the Secretary of War for the Warrants for any Land we may be intitled to for said services from the United States. And we do also further authorized our said attorney to call on the proper department for all & any arreages of pay & emoluments which we or either of us are intitled to for our said services as aforesaid in the Virginia Contineltal line the Regiment being commanded by Colo Edw'd Stevens [Edward Stevens] of the Tenth Virginia Regiment on contineltal establishment and we do hereby bestow said attorney with full & ample powers to do & perform all & every thing & things which we could do were we personally present & our attorney or attorney under him to [two undeciphered words] at his pleasure revoke hereby ratifying & confirming what ever said attorney may or shall lawfully do in the premises
