At a quarterly Court held for King and Queen County at the Courthouse on Monday the 12<sup>th</sup> of August 1811

William Bowden appeared in Court And it is Ordered that it be certified to the Executive from satisfactory evidence that the said William Bowden served three years in the Second Virginia State Regiment and from his own oath that he had never before proved or claimed his right to land for the service above mentioned

King & Queen County to witt

George Jerson of lawfull age appeared before me John Waller a Justice of the peace for said County and made oath that William Bowden who has rec'd a Certificate from the County Court of King and Queen served as a soldier three years in the Second Virginia State Rigiment it being the full Length of time he enlisted for given under my hand the 12 day of December 1811

King & Queen County to witt

John Bland [VAS2535 and/or VAS2536] of Lawfull age appeared before me John Waller a Justice of the peace for said County and made oath that William Bowden who has received a Cetificate from the County Court of King and Queen served as a soldier three years in the Second Virginia State Regiment it being the full Length of time he enlisted for given under my hand this 12 day of December 1811

I do hereby Certefy the William Bowden served the term of three years as a soilder in the second Virginia State Redgment given under my hand this 5<sup>th</sup> day January 1813 John hisXmark Bland

I do hereby Certify that William Bowden served the term of three years as a soilder in the second Virginia State Redgment given under my hand this 7<sup>th</sup> day of January 1813
