Personally appeard before me the undersigned a justice of the peace for the said City Richard Baker, and made oath, that Edmond Brown enlisted under Captain Edward Diggs [sic: Edward Digges R13760], in the City of Williamsburg in the year 1778, for three years, and that the said Edmond Brown served in the war of the Revolution and was legally Dischaged at the siege of York [Yorktown, 28 sep - 19 Oct 1781], what day and month this affiant Cannot precisely remember Given under my hand this [blank] day of February in year 1821

City of Richmond, towit.

Personally appeared before me the undersigned a justice of the peace for the said City, John Brown, and made oath that Edmund Brown enlisted under Captain Edward Digges in the City of Williamsburg in the year 1778 for three years and that the said Edmund Brown served in the war of the Revolution and was legally discharged at the Siege of York what day and month this affiant cannot precisely remember. Given under my hand this [blank] day of [illegible] 1821.
