## Northumberland County Virginia

The deposition of Alexander Dodson of Richmond County (aged seventy five) taken before Thomas H Haney a Justice of the peace for the County of Northumberland on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1831. The deponent Sayeth that Joseph Bryant of Richmond County was in the Army of the revolution, that he reccollects perfectly his return from the army at the close of the War, & that he has allways understood from the said Bryant, as well as from common rumor that he was in the army five years [two or three undeciphered words] & this deponent further sayeth not given under my hand the date above written Test L. S. Winstead

## North'd. County virginia

The deposition of Mary W Headley aged seventy nine years taken before Thomas Bell a Justice of the peace for the county of North'd on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of March 1833. The deponent saith that Joseph Bryant of Richmond County was in the army of the revolution that she recollects well that the said Joseph Bryant returned home on a furlow and stayed some time and returned again to the said army of the revolution and returned home again after the war was ended. this deponent saith she knows not how many years e was in the army and further this deponent saith not. Given under my hand this 14 day of March 1833.

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the twelth day of July 1781, in the name of Joseph Bryant as Soldier of Cavalry for £67.13.2, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to John Stogdale[?] and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.
