The memorial of William Bryant to the executive of Virginia

I William Bryant of Lincoln County Ky. aged 70[?] years and five months respectfully represent unto the executive of Virginia that he enlisted in the year 1782 in Col. Armands [Charles Armand BLWt2291-850] troops of the Virginia Cont'l line as a private and that he enlisted to serve during the revolutionary war, and served untill he was Legally discharged on the 15<sup>th</sup> of November 1783 at the end of the war. he would state that he received no discharge in writing but the regiment in which he served was dismissed generally at the period he mentions, he thinks his Capt's name was Taylor, and the name of the Major was Hubbard. he thinks it probable that he may have enrolled as William Bryan but Bryant is his right name, he states that he served in the same company with his brother John Bryant (or Bryan, whose name will be found in Ser Doc. 42. that he was born in the month of November 1765. He requests the executive of Virginia to direct the Register of the Land office of Virginia to issue a warrant to his attorny in John L Ballinger for the quantity of Land due him on account of his services in Armands troops of the Cont'l line from the time he enlisted to the end of the war of the revolution
