## Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Major Budd VAS2753

[The following are from bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia.]

I certify that Robert Russell Sen'r [W5753] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that Major Budd of this Co enlisted in the same Regiment (9th) with the witness for three years & was captured at Germantown [4 Oct 1777] & imprisoned with the witness & was in service & imprisonment nearly or quite four years. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for the Co. of Accomack this 21<sup>st</sup> Jany 1834 Wm Custis

Levin Hyslop [W7858] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that he was well acquainted with Major Budd of this Co & that said Budd enlisted in the 9th Va Reg't for three years & was captured at Germantown & imprisoned with the witness & was in service & imprisonment about four years. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for said Co Accomack, the 21st Jany 1834

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 23rd day of December 1784, in the name of Major Budd as a Soldier of Infantry for £23.9.3, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Colo Cropper [John Cropper W3781] and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.
