Virginia documents pertaining to Toby Bull VAS2758

[The following are from bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia.]

Hillary Mears [Hilary Mears S18508] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that Toby Bull of this County enlisted in the 9th Va Reg't for three years & went away & was one from the County from three to four years, & it was always understood that he was captured & imprisoned at Germantown [4 Oct 1777] = that he the witness was in the Militia service keeping guard &c & does not know the fact of s'd Bull's being captured, but does know that he enlisted for three years & was absent nearly four years. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for the County of Accomack this 21st Jany 1834.

Wm. R. Custis J.P

I certify that Robert Russell sen'r [W5753] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that Toby Bull of this County enlisted in Capt Sneads [Thomas Snead] Company for three years — was captured at Germantown with the Witness & was in service & imprisonment nearly or quite four years. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for Accomack Co this 21st day of Jany 1834.

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 14th day of December 1784, in the name of Toby Bull as a Soldier of Infantry for £,15.15.4, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Abel Wright and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.
