I certify that John Bully served in the Virginia Navy in the Revolutionary War for the space of three years James Burk in the capacity of Boatswain. James Burk [S6649]

I certify that John Britton served in the Virginia Navy in the Revolutionary War for three years in the capacity of Master.

I certify also that John Bully served with me for three years in said War & served for three years in the capacity of Boatswain. Tho Jennings Sen'r [Thomas Jennings] Thosmming Jan [Norfolk Borough, 27 Dec 1831]

I certify that John Britton served three years in the Virginia Navy with me in the Revolutionary War in the Capacity of Master. [William Jennings S5615] If we January

The Heirs of John Bulley, who was a Boatswain in the State Navy in the Revolutionary War, respectfully ask of the Executive of Virginia, the allowance to them, of the Land Bounty to which their ancestor is entitled.

The file the Certificate of the Auditor that John Bully's name is on the Records of the depreciation Pay list – that of the Register that he has never rec'd Land Bounty & the affidavit of Wm. Jennings, Jas Burk & Thomas Jennings that John Bulley served with them for 3 years./ Jany 12th 1832.

I certify that John Britton served with me three years 1778, 1779 & 1780 in the Virginia Navy in the James Burk Revolutionary War in the character of Master

I certify that John Bully served on board the Patriot in the Virginia Navy in the Revolutionary War with me for three years in character of Boatswain. The Jammes
