The heirs of Solo. Bunting pray an allowance of Bounty Land for his Services as a private for the term of during the War in the Va Cont'l line.

Levin Hyslop a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that Solomon Bunting of this county enlisted in the 11th Va Regt for the term of during the War & served till the War ended in the Cont'l. line, and that he the witness was in the 9th Va Regt. The witness also says that s'd Bunting was in Capt Thos Parkers Company. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for the County of Accomack this 29th Jany 1834. [illegible signature]

Hillary Mears a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that Solomon Buntin enlisted in Capt Parkers Company in the 11th Va Regt for the term of during the War & served till the end of the War. Given under my hand & seal as a justice of the peace in & for Accomack County this 29th Hany 1834 [illegible signature]

Parker Copes a Revolutionary soldier & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that he served a term of 18 months in Capt Parkers Co. in the 11th Va Regt Cont'l line & that Solomon Bunting of this County enlisted for & served during the war in said Company & was discharged at the end of the War. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for said County this 29th Jany 1834 [illegible signature]

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 2nd day of November 1784, in the name of Solomon Bunting as a Soldier of Infantry for £15.17.4, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Colo. Cropper and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.
