These are to Certify that Dawson Burgess Formerly a Sergant in the 6th Virginia Regiment has duly and faithfully serv'd the Term of Three years for which he was Inlisted in [three undeciphered words] of which and at his Own request he is hereby Discharged from any farther Service in in the Army of the United States and permited to return to his home free and unmolested, he haveing received all his Bounty pay and Cloathing and [illegible word] of pay and Cloathing in full of all allowances and provision made by the Congress for their Troops, his Receipt for which is on the Back hereof.

Given under my hand at Philadelphia this 1st Day of February 1780

I do hereby acknowledge to [have received] from the united States Army Bounty pay and Cloathes & Deficiency of pay & Cloathing due me [several undecipherred words] in full.
